

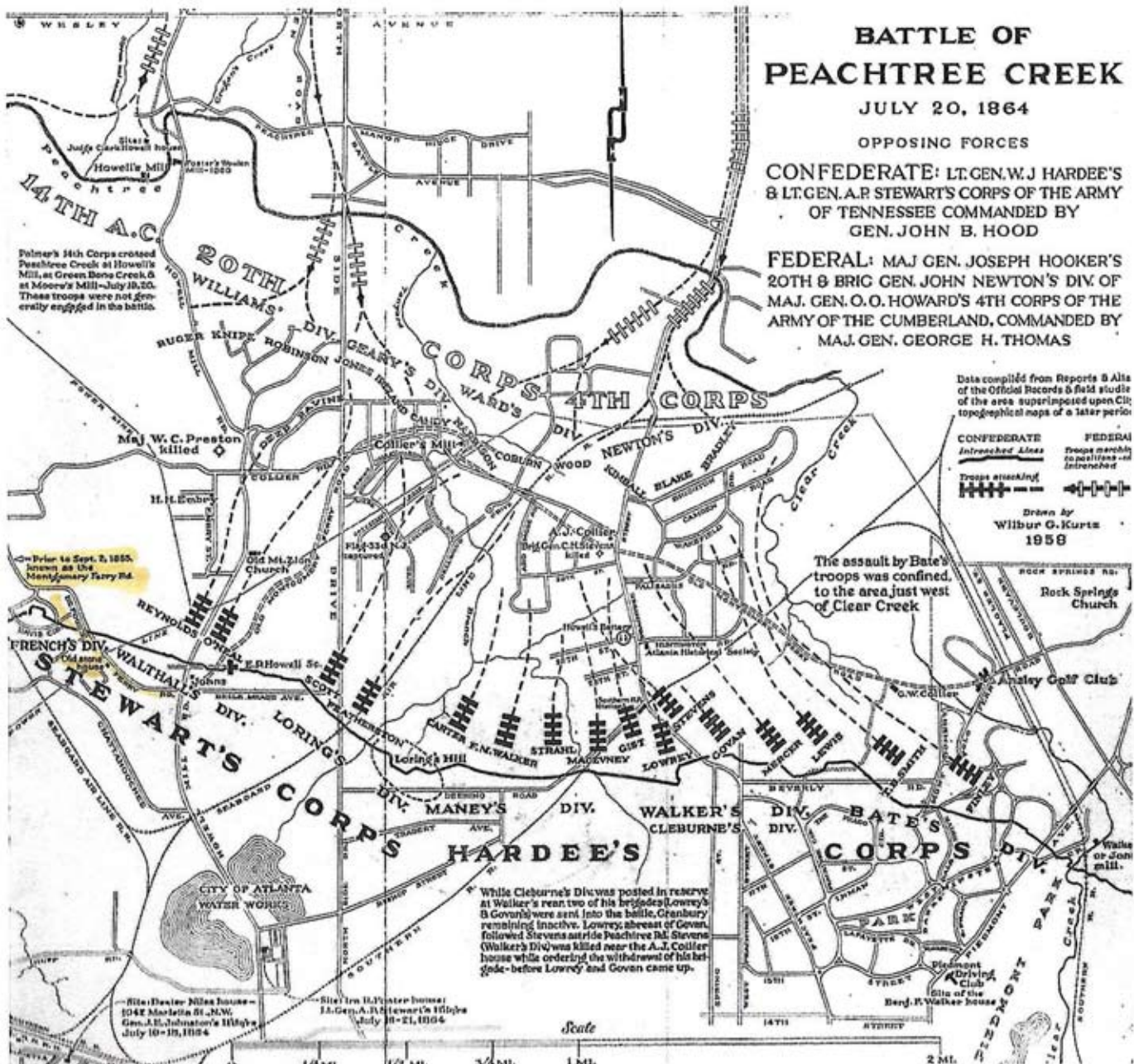
BATTLE OF PEACHTREE CREEK

The assault by Bate's troops was confined to the area just west of Clear Creek

While Cleburne's Div. was posted in reserve at Walker's rear two of his brigades (Lowrey's & Gowan's) were sent into the battle. Cleburne remained inactive. Lowrey's retreat of Gowan's followed Stevens as he Peachtree Rd. Stevens (Walker's Div.) was killed near the A. J. Collier house while ordering the withdrawal of his brigade before Lowrey and Gowan came up.

Palmer's 14th Corps crossed Peachtree Creek at Howell's Mill, at Green Bona Creek & at Moore's Mill—July 19, 20. These troops were not generally engaged in the battle.
